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Lenexa-Based Browsersoft Selected to Connect Community Health Clinics and Hospitals in San Antonio for Health Information Exchange.

Lenexa, KS (June 19, 2006), — Browsersoft, Inc., a Kansas-based software application development and services firm, today announced that they have been selected to implement a secure health records exchange system by San Antonio based Access to Care for the Uninsured (ACU). The health records exchange system is a major technology component of ACU's grant from the Healthy Communities Access Program administered by the US Department of Health and Human Services.

The ultimate goal for ACU is to utilize OpenHRE™, a software toolkit developed by Browsersoft, to enable the secure exchange of health records between local health systems within the Greater San Antonio area to increase the quality of care for the communities' uninsured. According to Dewey Biscotto, ACU's Executive Director, "The health records exchange system will allow care providers the ability to view a consolidated presentation of a patient's health history assembled from multiple points of care."

Browsersoft was selected by ACU after extensive investigation of existing health exchange efforts, associated software development firms and current technologies under evaluation from similar initiatives across the country.
